## LETTER FROM CEO



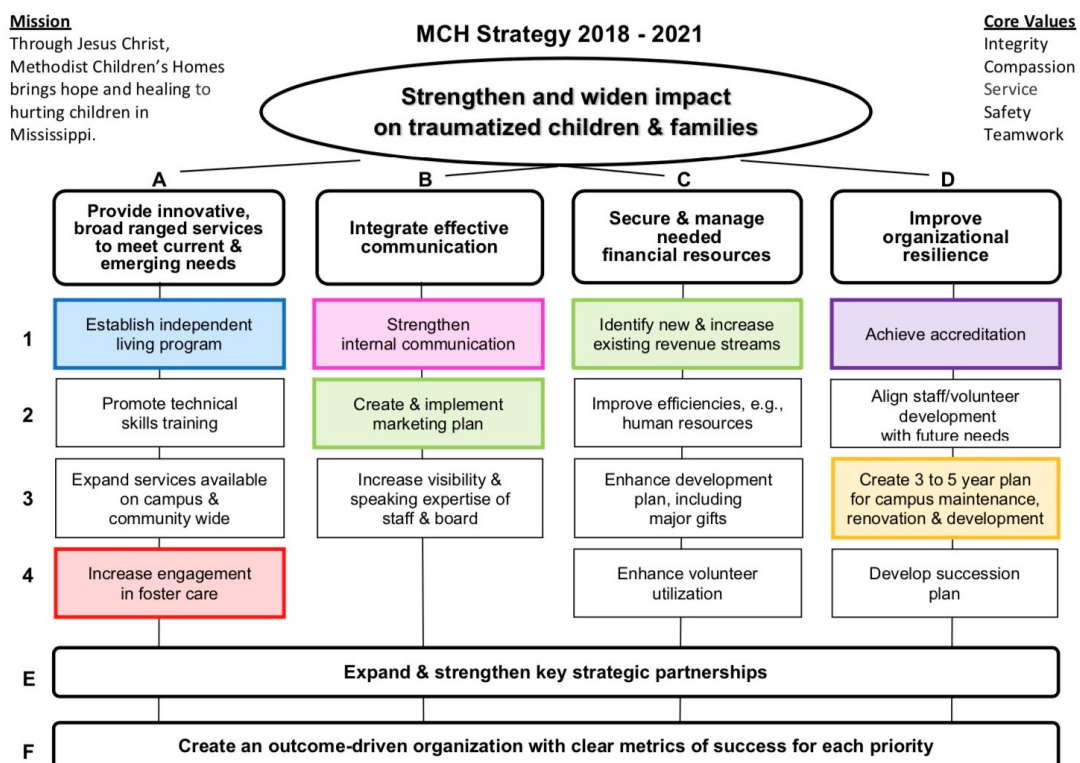

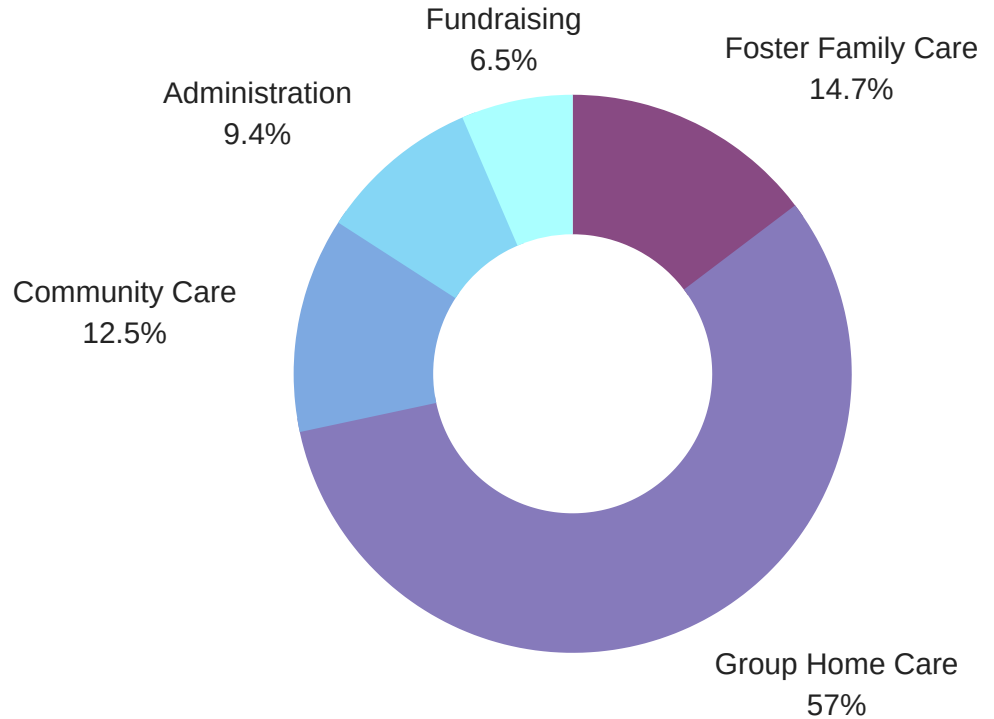

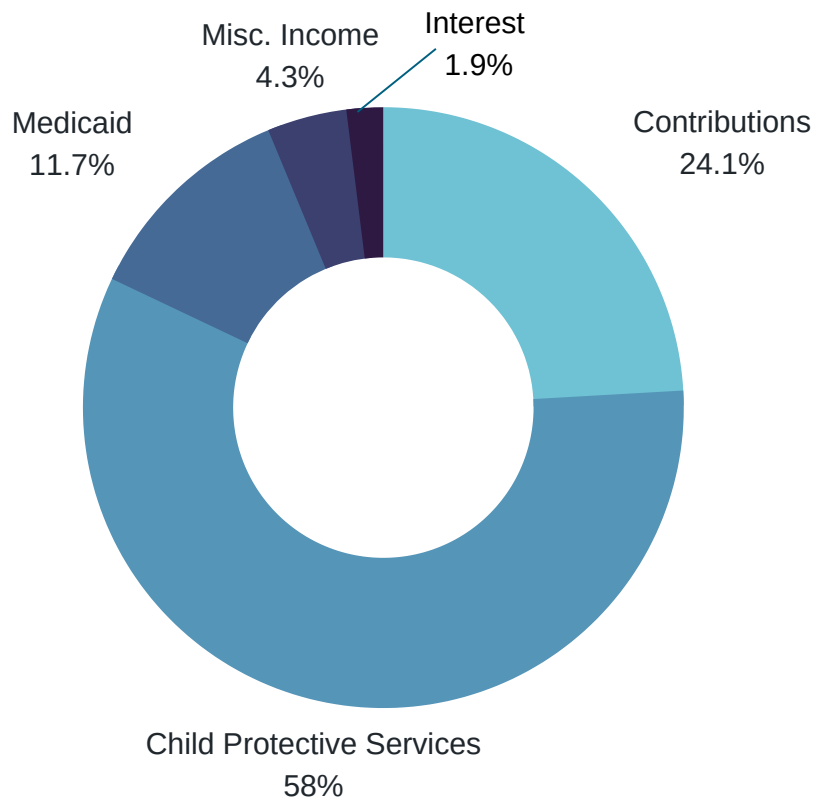
